ii. Te Kamo Shared path will be open in November. Maybe this could

iii. WDC & Councillors have received the first draft of the thirty-year	
Future Development Strategy. Public consultation is set for July	
and August.	
iv. Deb questioned what communication KCi had had recently from	Deb to pass Ruth's
WDC over projects that directly affect Te Kamo. Kci has had no	contact info to

v. The T2 priority bus lane will be created later this year.	
vi. LTP update. Councillors were asked to cut it lean and take out all	
the bells and whistles. But there were still valid community-	
requested projects such as footpaths in Hikurangi and shared path	
to complete in Waipu. They think they made fair choices. The final	
plan will be adopted in July.	
vii. The new airport location is still a case study. Gavin said they had	
just received the environmental assessment for Ruatangata today	
so no-one has had a chance to look at it yet. Gavin said a new	
airport location is needed.	

viii. Engagement with Hapu.

We had a lengthy discussion about our attempts to liaise with and consult local hapu. KCi has been open and willing and after a couple of years of trying we feel we have not made much progress. Charm asked if there is any other hapu we need to speak with. Deb says that the correct and only Hapu is Ngati Kahu o Torongare at Ngararatunua Marae. She suggests we meet directly at the Marae. Deb to contact the Hapu and to find out when they are meeting and see if we can attend and speak. David also suggested he could contact Huhana Lindon.

Trap giveaway went really well and Charm has received 25 more traps – waiting for people to come and collect them! Trying to follow up.

The signs have arrived and are bigger than expected. We need to ask the Car sales yard and owners of land on Kamo Road for permission to erect them.

Good news is that NRC has redone KCi logo for us and given it to Charm in a form easy to use.

iv. Funding

Charm applied to COGS for \$5.5k for three months of her time. Grassroots application is due end of this month. This will include funds for Charm's time and printing and distribution costs for two issues of Connect.
